STREETLIFE VOLUNTEER OUTREACH PROJECT

Title: STREETLIFE Outreach Support Assistant

Main Purpose: The main purpose of the evening outreach support assistant is to support

staff to reach out and engage with clients; providing emotional and practical

support as well as motivational support for longer-term engagement.

Responsible to: Volunteer Mentor and Support Officer/Street Life Project Manager

Background: The Safer Wales's Street Life project has been operating in Cardiff since

2005 and has transformed the lives of many women impacted by sex work

and victims and survivors of sexual exploitation.

Many clients who access the project suffer from poor physical, mental, and sexual health and struggle with unresolved issues related to historic child sex abuse or family breakdown/being in care. They are entrenched in high-risk behaviors, lack confidence, and are reluctant to engage with mainstream

services.

We believe that women who are exploited through prostitution have the right to be safe and can access appropriate support. We work to enhance safety and increase well-being through a collaborative human rights and harm

reduction approach.

Outreach delivery The Street Life evening outreach service is a crucial part of service delivery.

The evening outreach service is led by StreetLife Project staff and supported

by our team of trained volunteers and representation from partnership

agencies.

Outreach aims to Reach out and engage with people who are impacted by sex work and

victims of sexual exploitation, who are often a hidden population and who do

not necessarily access mainstream service.

Build and sustain ongoing trusting relationships to facilitate access to a wide

range of services.

Provide a wide range of front-line harm reduction, information, health, and

other initiatives/services.

Facilitate improvements in health and well-being and reduce the risks

associated with sex work.

Advertise and promote wider services offered by the project.

Provide a referral and support gateway to other services.

Identify cases of sexual exploitation of young people and other forms of exploitation, provide appropriate support, and make appropriate referrals and interventions.

Main Duties:

To provide practical and emotional support to clients

To provide support to the outreach support workers.

Provide women with support, refreshments, and access to services through the StreetLife Project.

Report any relevant information as appropriate to the project.

Ensure the van is properly stocked and ready for the next session.

To ensure health and safety procedures are followed.

Ensure procedures and guidelines are followed.

To complete any monitoring forms as required.

Maintain confidentiality in accordance with Safer Wales LTD's confidentiality policy.

Training

All StreetLife Outreach volunteers receive induction training. The aim of the training is to prepare volunteers for outreach. Following induction, all volunteer positions are subject to a three-month probationary period.

Support and Supervision

Once recruited, the Outreach Volunteer Assistant will receive regular support sessions and supervision. Support will also be provided by the Volunteer Coordinator and Project Manager as and when needed.

Commitment

The nature of the project is to provide a regular outreach service. We ask that volunteer drivers give a minimum commitment to the project of one evening per fortnight. Safer Wales requires a minimum commitment of six months to the project.

Equal Opportunities:

Safer Wales is fully committed to actively promoting equal opportunities as an employer and providing all its services. It is the responsibility of all staff and volunteers to ensure the practical application of this policy.
