

Safer Wales: Centre Activities Project

(This role is only open to female applicants as an occupational requirement exception under Sch 9 of the Equality Act 2010.)

Role Description

Title: Volunteer Centre Assistant

Primary Purpose: To assist and work alongside staff with the day-to-day running of the centre and to help support vulnerable women to have access to the facilities and essential items following the change that lasts model. Volunteers will also engage with staff by delivering/ assisting with activities and with the preparation of emergency food parcels.

Responsible to: Scheme Coordinator & Volunteer Mentor and Support Officer

Location: Safer Wales, Castle House, Castle Street, Cardiff CF10 1BS

Background: Safer Wales Volunteering Service supports Safer Wales projects in helping victims of domestic abuse, sexual violence, and sexual exploitation. For the last 20 years, we have been working with victims of domestic violence, rape, sexual abuse, exploitation and hate crime. Following the change of the Last model, Safer Wales Centre is working to help support vulnerable women to access facilities, activities and other essential items.

Main Duties:

You will attend alongside the centre staff to assist with supporting the women in a variety of different ways. These duties involve:



- Interacting with the women who come to the centre for appointments and helping them with their basic needs.
- Assisting with logistics and ensuring a smooth flow of events by helping to organize and arrange donations within the centre, notably maintaining our clothes section and making sure there is a variety of clothes to pick from.
- Volunteers will be required to appropriately update any feedback forms, and monitoring forms and regularly update our spreadsheets to help staff with reporting.
- Encourage dialogue or support to provide women with a sense of community and emotional support.
- Attending alongside staff, volunteers, and clients to create a warm, inviting, and safe environment for the women to attend while ensuring a safe space.
- Ensuring health and safety standards are maintained and following appropriate risk assessments in place.
- Based on results and participant feedback, volunteers should assess the effectiveness of programs and provide improvement recommendations to the staff in charge.

Training

Volunteers will receive a two-part blended induction and will receive on-thejob training relevant to the needs of the individual along with updates on volunteering opportunities. Volunteers will receive all necessary support and information through email, telephone calls and online meetings.

Commitment

The nature of this volunteer role is to provide support to the Safer Wales team. We ask that volunteers give a minimum commitment to the project of one morning/afternoon a week (Monday – Friday). The Centre is open from 09:00



- 4:00. Volunteers can be flexible as to which days they volunteer but within an agreed rota prepared in advance.

Equal Opportunities
